Tech Tips- Carrie Davenport

Phishing is not a new phenomenon – it has been the most common attack vector for cybercriminals for a number of years – but, due to the increasing complexity of phishing scams, knowing how to spot email phishing is becoming more important than ever before.!

7 Tips to Spot Phishing Emails

1. Emails Demanding Urgent Action

Emails threatening a negative consequence, or a loss of opportunity unless urgent action is taken, are often phishing emails.

2. Emails with Bad Grammar and Spelling Mistakes

Another way to spot email phishing is bad grammar and spelling mistakes.

3. Emails with an Unfamiliar Greeting or Salutation

Emails exchanged between friends/colleagues usually have an informal salutation.

4. Inconsistencies in Email Addresses, Links & Domain Names

Another way how to spot phishing is by finding inconsistencies in email addresses, links and domain names.

5. Suspicious Attachments

Emails with attachments should always be treated suspiciously – especially if they have an unfamiliar extension or one commonly associated with malware (.zip, .exe, .scr, etc.).

6. Emails Requesting Login Credentials, Payment Information or Sensitive Data

Emails originating from an unexpected or unfamiliar sender that requests login credentials, payment information or other sensitive data should always be treated with caution. .

7. Too Good to Be True Emails

Too good to be true emails are those which incentivize the recipient to click on a link or open an attachment by claiming there will be a reward of some nature.

When in doubt, call the person who "sent" you the email to make sure it is legit and not part of a phishing attempt to get information or money!,

A huge thank you to all the counties that reported! One concern stands out, however. There were many counties that reported there is no Committee Chair or No Activity for this program. That brings about the question of Why? We are all continually serving our active military and their families throughout the year and all of these actions are reportable.

Understanding the difference between reporting on National Security and Veterans Administration & Rehabilitation can, and does, often pose confusion among members. For clarity: National Security is assisting service members that are still in uniform, that are currently serving, are in full occupation of part of a military source, Reservists or National Guard, or are still in active duty and in recovery to be redeployed but are in a VA Medical or Rehabilitation center, and their families. Whereas Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation is focused on those that are out of uniform, transitioning from active duty to discharge, retired, or disabled, and their family members.

When we are reporting we can employ the 5 W's and H. It can help us understand where your impact numbers fall when reporting. Who did we help? What did we help them with? When did we help them? Who were involved? How much funding was needed? How many miles were traveled while we were helping? And, most importantly, Where do we need to follow up? On <u>www.deptny.org</u> there are members tracking sheets available to the members as a tool to keep track of where your efforts are and then at the end of the reporting period it will make it much easier to compile your good deeds. For help locating active-duty military and their families visit a local recruiting station, contact your local National Guard Armory, or even contact your neighborhood schools. There are always ways of which we can assist our active-duty service people and their families.

The first quarter zoom meeting with the Eastern Division Chair and National Chair for National Security is complete. Our focus is still advocating for the BE THE ONE initiative. 'Quality of Life' should be in the forefront of everyone's mind and our active-duty service should be included in this initiative as well as our veterans. Currently, the American Legion Family has partnered with Columbia University to share training for those who want to learn more about interacting and responding to an individual who may be in crisis. At <u>www.legion.org</u> there is a free 90-minute session available to American Legion Family members and the community to learn useful skills to recognize and determine at-risk individuals. There are three sessions left available and those are filling up fast.

There was a fun suggestion brought forth from National Chair, Barbara Washburn, that in support of our active-duty service members is to Wear RED on Fridays; and, then let us know with pictures, Where in the World is your RED shirt? These audits ensure that your funds are being used as put forth in guidelines of both the National and State policies. Balances agree with bank statements, ledgers, and receipts. We have all heard of funds disappearing or being withdrawn for personal use. While these funds may be paid back, this practice is not acceptable. These funds belong to the Auxiliary that our Members raised for the designated program. An audit committee should consist of two to three members and the Treasurer/VAVS Representative available to answer questions. The Finance Committee wishes everyone safe and happy holidays.

There are still veteran issues that we need to continue to urge our senators and legislators to support and pass. They include:

Guard VA Benefits Act would grant the VA authority to clamp down on scamming agencies that make money by promising a better disability rating and charging inflated prices. The Legion offers free filing for vets using accredited service officers.

S. 2327 and H.R. 4637 would allow for our allies' permanent residency in America. Over 70,000 Afghan allies have been relocated to our country with no way to become residents after fighting alongside our soldiers abroad.

The Love Lives On Act would ensure surviving spouses are able to retain their benefits from both the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and Department of Defense (DoD) upon remarriage at any age. The bill includes surviving spouses from active-duty, veterans and retired servicemembers. Our military and their families served honorably and earned their benefits through their service and sacrifices.

Our national security is dependent on our Coast Guard and their mission. H.R. 2693, Pay Our Coast Guard Parity Act of 2023 would ensure the Coast Guard be provided with the same personnel protection as all other branches of our Armed Services.

There are still many bills that would support our veterans, active-duty military, and families. Keep up to date and make your voice count.

Also sign up for the Grass Roots Center on the Legion website. We have the power in our voices to advocate for our veterans, military, and their families. Once the Post Adjutant/Officer signs the application (ORIGINAL SIGNATURES – NO PHOTOCOPIES) and the membership chair (ALA) verifies all supporting documents, return the supporting documents to the member. The office only needs the completed – signed application with the dues and transmittal. Remember – if the veteran is living,he/she MUST BE A CURRENT PAID MEMBER IN THE AMERICAN LEGION. Remember to check which era the veteran served and the relationship of the veteran to the ALA applicant. Please circle the appropriate relationship to the veteran.

Applications need to be complete and legible otherwise they will be returned to the unit membership chair. New members' addresses needs to be complete. No abbreviations on city/town. All membership applications must be presented to the unit membership chairman with the proper documentation prior to being submitted to the office for processing.

- Membership chairs if your unit members move, change any contact information, phone numbers, emails, etc., please send the change to the Department office or if you have unit write or unit full, please make the appropriate changes so the information is updated in a timely manner. This also pertains to unit President, Membership Chair and Unit Treasurer.
- ATTENTION ALL ALAMIS FULL AND UNIT WRITE USERS: Please enter your completed membership applications in the ALAMIS system as you have the ability to do so. If you have Unit Full, you should enter the application, making updates to the members information and paying the dues. However, you still need to send the completed application WITH the new members ID number and unit number on it. Failure to follow simple instructions will result in your ALAMIS access to be suspended.
- Newsletters E-mail copies of the Newsletter are available to any member wanting a free copy. Please e-mail anyone of us at the office with a valid email and we will get you on the list. If you do not have email and someone in the unit/county would like to receive it on your behalf, please let us know so we can add them to the list. If you receive a copy of the newsletter via email, please share it with the members in your unit or county. Mailed copies of the Newsletters are available at the cost of \$15.00 per year.
